Since 2010, Eubios Ethics Institute in cooperation with partner institutions including American University of Sovereign Nations (AUSN), UNESCO, Hiroshima Peace Culture Foundation and others have organized ten Youth Peace Ambassador (YPA) and seven Youth Looking Beyond Disaster (LBD) Training Workshops across the world with 900 youth from 50 countries. No matter what your circumstances or age you are welcome to join. Together, the participants identify issues that can promote a culture of peace. So far they have developed 350 action projects promoted at making a difference in their communities. Participants will also present their LBD or YPA action plan developed with the mentoring of the facilitators at the Workshop during the event. In the presentation of the action plan that you can develop you can join together with other person(s) up to 3 per team. You will be able to change during the workshop, as you learn from the examples of previous action plans, and make new connections with people from other countries.

**Fees**: All participants should pay the registration price that includes accommodation from the 2<sup>nd</sup> evening and food from the 3<sup>rd</sup> February to lunch, 9<sup>th</sup> February, and travel in the group between Bangkok and Kaeng Krachan return, trips to hot springs, Royal Projects, beach, National Park, and other excursions. Early bird fee USD 400 by 31 December 2015; Payment after 1 January 2016 or on site payment will be USD 500 in cash. Payment may be made by credit card or bank transfer. Single room supplement is USD 200. There is a 10% discount for a group of five or more delegates arriving and departing on the same flight.
