Workshop objectives:

At the end of this workshop participants will be:

1. Trained in various teaching methods on health care ethics through a multidisciplinary and cross-cultural approach;
2. Able to develop local case study series for ethics teaching in a multidisciplinary manner in their specific areas, for example in health care, science and technology studies, public health, and so on;

3. Able to appreciate methods of bioethics research design and publication;
4. Able to complete a publication-ready manuscript on local case series through a multidisciplinary approach;
5. Able to write and assess graduate thesis in bioethics.
6. Received formal credit hours towards postgraduate degrees and professional development courses

Background

Perdana University (PERDANA), Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) and the American University of Sovereign Nations (AUSN) jointly organize a workshop that aims at providing a platform for multidisciplinary exchanges in developing case series for teaching medical and healthcare ethics. Faculties of the workshop include experts and practitioners in bioethics, medical and healthcare ethics teaching with international reputations, yet uniquely-enriched local experiences. These include members of the Consortium of Ethics and Medical Humanities Network. Participants will go through sessions of lectures addressing different methods and innovations in ethics teaching as well as critical analysis on gaps in teaching ethics and various issues in developing manuscripts and publishing in bioethics. Participants will also be guided through group works where they will have opportunities to share their cases and develop them into case series manuscripts for publications. Participants will thus take advantage not only from the training in ethics teaching, but also from getting their cases, and papers, published.

Teaching ethics in medical and healthcare disciplines has always been challenging. Experts in education have spent decades debating on how best to deliver the subject, which contain not only knowledge, but also social skills and values. Teachers are struggling with delivery and assessment methods. Simple class-based one-way lectures have been severely criticized for its grave limitations in inculcating needed social skills and values for the professions. Along with other innovative teaching methods, case-based teachings have emerged as a useful option. There are quite a number of case series publications highlighting key issues in medical and healthcare ethics that are useful for teachers in delivering specific topics. However, many of the issues in ethics are culture-specific. In the mean time, it is noteworthy that ethics teachers who are also experienced professionals in their respective medical and healthcare disciplines are rich with such cases that they encounter throughout their professional life. This underlines the potential of exploring cases that are relevant to the culture where most graduates will work as well as developing capacity of ethics teachers in making use of the cases for their teaching sessions.

This Workshop is counted as formal credit hours for the AUSN Masters and PhD degrees, including additional sessions.
